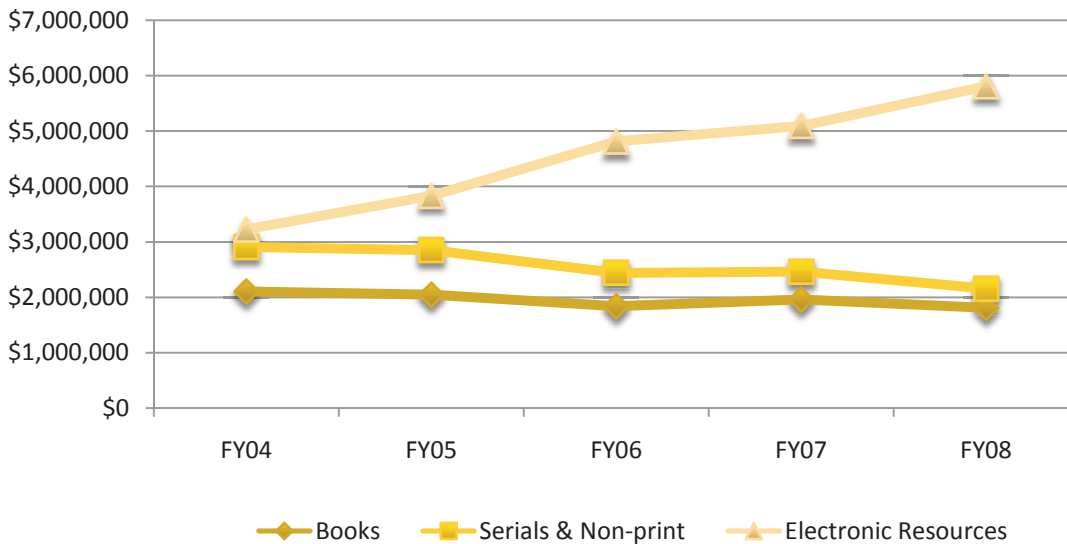
## Collections

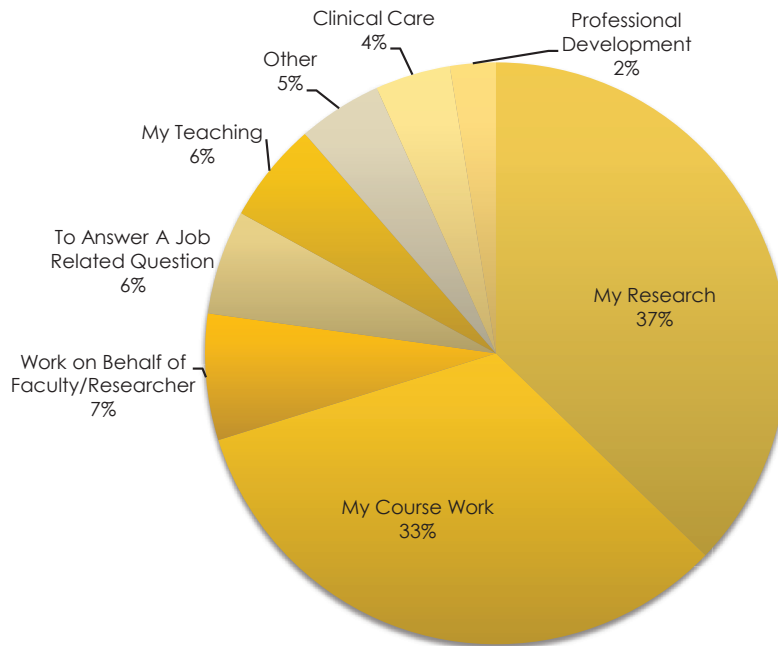

Measuring the Impact of Networked Electronic Services (MINES), an online, transaction-based survey that collects data on the purpose of use of electronic resources and the demographics of users.

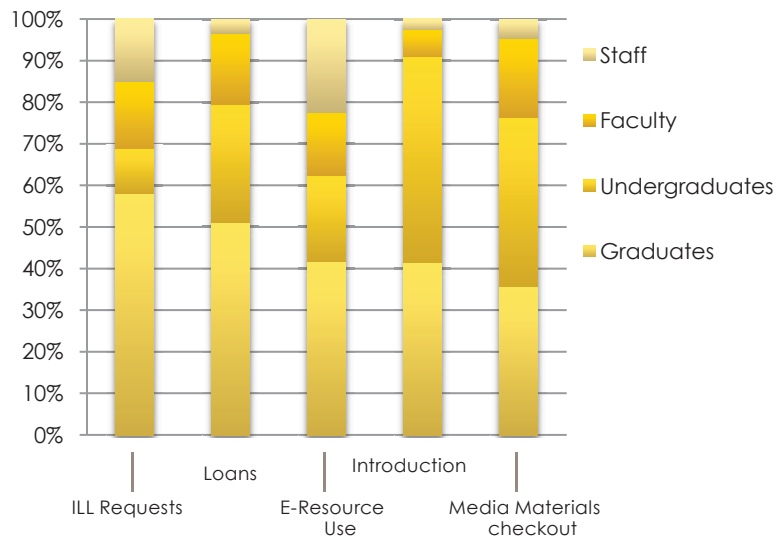


## On Campus

In addition to borrowing materials from the Libraries, graduate students are among the largest users of interlibrary loan and e-resources. Undergraduates make up the bulk of our media materials checkout.

Over 18,000 participants attended 911 instructional sessions lead by UI Librarians: 81% of these sessions were course-related instruction. Over 73,500 reference questions were answered in-person by library staff at our information desks.

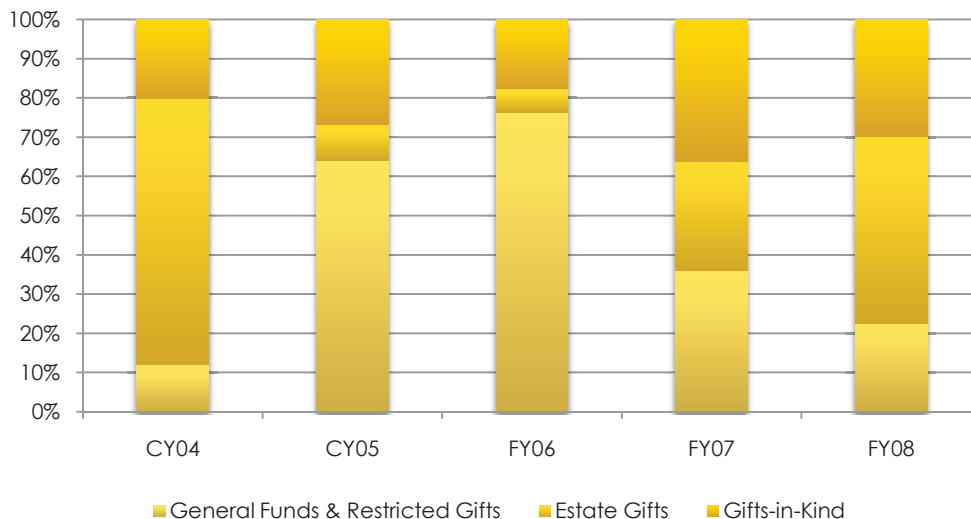

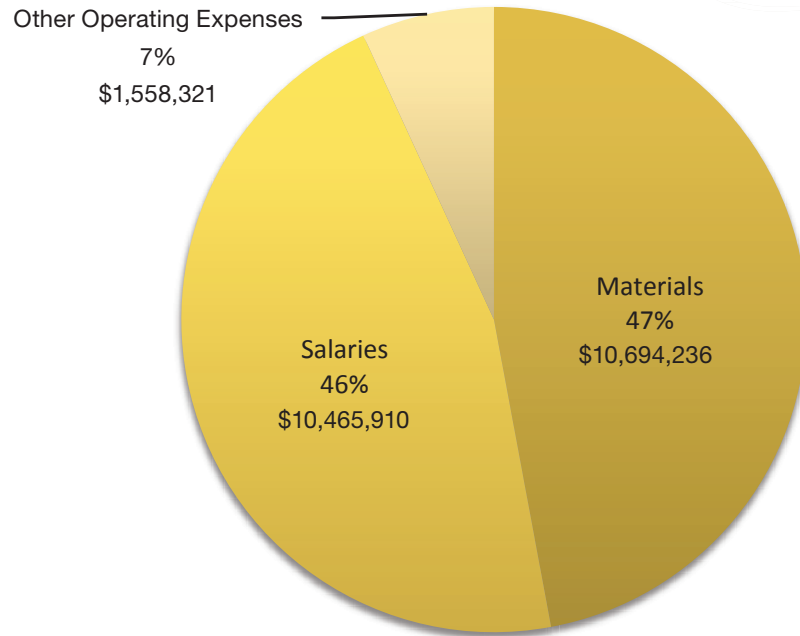
