**Dr. Helkiah Crooke (1576-1648):
The Historical and Literary Legacy of an Early Modern Physician**

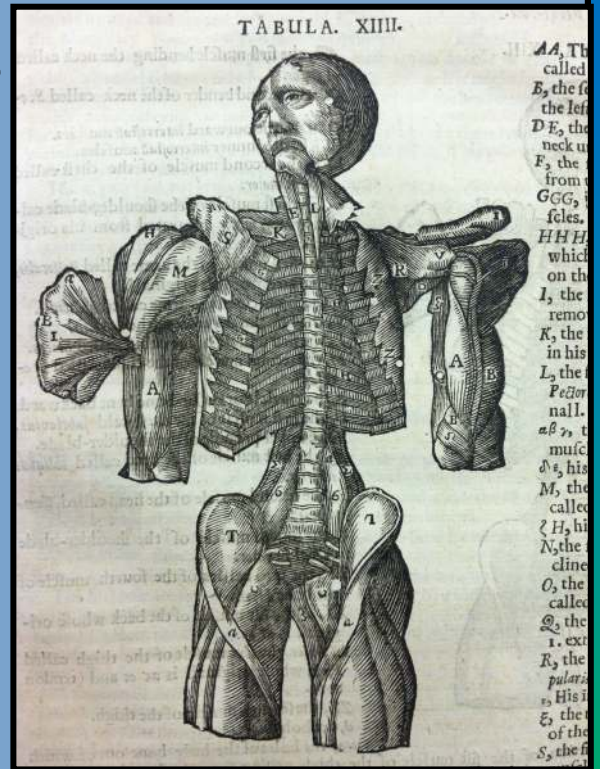

Dr. Helkiah Crooke wrote the first comprehensive English anatomy manual. His book, *Mikrokosmographia*, was printed by William Jaggard, who also pub-

lished Shakespeare's First Folio. But both Crooke's and Jaggard's careers were endangered by their decision to produce this controversial text, which made detailed medical knowledge available to the general public. A close examination of Crooke's career as an author and physician provides insight into shifting views on medical authority at a crucial point in the history of Western medicine.
